

SecAF Restriction of Movement Due to Travel



- Effective 10 Nov 20, SecAF directed Air Force Components to identify all Service members who are traveling from foreign countries to the U.S.
- Covered personnel will be placed under a 14-day ROM (aka self-quarantine) by Travel Approval Authority (O-6 or higher) if deemed appropriate based on RiskAssessment.
- More Specifically, if the foreign country has a higher incident rate, 14 day ROM is recommended. If incident rate is equal or lower to U.S., 14 day ROM is not deemed necessary

Leisure Travel Risk Assessment Breakdown *CC/Director Discretion*



- 1. Member or leadership review links in slide 3
- 2. Member provide leadership with Itinerary and modes of Transportation
- 3. Questions to ask member:
 - a. Is the member at increased risk of COVID due to comorbid conditions? (diabetes, high blood pressure, cancer history etc)
 - b. Has member lived with someone who might be at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19?
 - c. Does the destination have travel restrictions due to COVID or is a high risk COVID location per Slide #3?
 - d. Is the member or anyone in the traveling party currently ill?

4.If all answers are NO then member is cleared to travel but should continue to use social distancing, hand washing and mask wearing at all times.

If the answer to any question is YES it is NOT RECOMMENDED that the member should travel.

5. Provide member with "How to Protect Yourself & Others" flyer prior to travel.



Post-Leisure Travel - Protocols



Active Duty and Beneficiaries WITH Symptoms

- Report to Cold & Cough Clinc for triage and possible testing
- Place in home isolation, unit provides care & feed as needed
- Active Duty will be place on Quarters
- If test comes back Positive, Public Health will be notified and will contact patient for contact tracing

Return to Work: 10 days quarantine from symptom onset and 24 hours of fever free w/o medication.

Active duty will be contacted by PCM team to return to duty

Civilian/Contractor WITH symptoms

Without Symptoms

- Need to seek care off base for triage and testing (Civilian Beneficiaries can be tested on base)
- Coordinate Isolation with unit
- Unit COVID POC contacts Public Health with Name and good contact phone number
- Public Health will contact member for contract tracing
- **Civilians must be cleared by Occupational Medicine to return to work 734-3421

Return to Work: 10 days quarantine from symptom onset and 24 hours of fever free w/o medication

- Member Notifies leadership/supervisor Close Contacts/Known Exposure/

- Supervision decides:
 - Place in Quarantine for 14 days
 - Return to work
- If symptoms develop, see top two boxes
- **No actions required if member has no symptoms and no known exposure while on leave, Cleared to return to duty

Return to Work: Automatically after 14 days unless test positive or develop symptoms
